Signs and Symptoms of Women with Acute Coronary Syndrome Oct 26 2023 Coronary artery disease is the most frequent cause of death among women in the United States. This may be due to differences in presentation of women with acute coronary syndrome. A convenience sample of 136 women who presented to an emergency department and were eventually diagnosed with ACS were reviewed for signs and symptoms at presentation, time to ECG and first cardiac medication. This study found that the majority of women (54.4%) presented with chest pain, however, a large number (45.6%) presented with other symptoms; SOB, syncope weakness and falls. The results are discussed in terms of Orem's Self Care Deficit Theory of Nursing.
