- 1) What was the result of the Compromise of 1820? Missouri enters as a slave state; Maine enters as a free state, a Temporary fix.
- 2) What was result of the 1850 Compromise? California was added to the Union as a free state. Stronger fugitive slave laws. Southwest territories would decide about slavery (Utah and New Mexico Territories are open to slavery). The result was a temporary fix with a more complex balance.

Debunking the myth that the Civil War released the nation from the grip of oligarchy expunging the sins of the Founding it reveals how and why the Old South not only survived in the West but thrived.
