Respiratory disorders form a major chunk contributing to neonatal mortality. There remains an emergent need to streamline the health delivery into a three-tier system which is hospital-based, and the use of indigenous or low cost systems of respiratory assistance. Neonatal research is evolving day-by-day and a lot of advances have been made in the respiratory support of sick newborns. In the 1970s, Gregory by his principle of application of CPAP created a distinct awareness based on its singular impact in neonatal respiratory care.
