Holden is deeply troubled by the "phoniness" of the adult world and is haunted by the death of his younger brother, Allie, which has left a lasting impact on him. He fantasizes about being "the catcher in the rye," a guardian who saves children from losing their innocence by catching them before they fall off a cliff into adulthood. The novel ends with Holden in a mental institution, where he is treated for a nervous breakdown. He expresses some hope for the future, indicating a path to recovery. Everyone has something to hide—especially high school juniors Spencer, Aria, Emily, and Hanna. Spencer covets her sister's boyfriend. Aria's fantasizing about her English teacher. Emily's crushing on the new girl at school. And Hanna uses some ugly tactics to stay beautiful. But they've all kept an even bigger secret since their friend Alison vanishing. How do I know? Because I know everything about the bad girls they were and the naive girls they are now. And guess what? I'm telling.
