In his examination of editions of Brahms's music, George Bozarth questions the popular notion that most of the composer's music already exists in reliable critical editions. Daniel Beller-McKenna reconsiders the younger Brahms's involvement in musical politics at midcentury. The cantata Rinaldo is the centerpiece of Carol Hess's consideration of Brahms's music as autobiographical statement.
