The soil is productive, the surface level. It is a farming community exclusively, the people being engaged in general farming, dairying, and stock raising - especially cattle and hogs. A heavy truck makes the round trip between Washington and Gettysburg three times a week, bringing farm products directly to Washington consumers. Cooperative buying is done on a small scale by the farmers' organization. There is no town or village in the township, but there are several stores. At one of these, located near NO Taverns, formerly a stage station, is the post office. The community shows every evidence of comfort and prosperity. Farmhouses are large and well kept, barns are commodious, with room for cattle and horses and storage places where grain and hay are kept in large quantities for consumption

on the farmstead rather than for transport and sale. The majority of the farms are well equipped with machine sheds, chicken coops, hog houses and pens.
