Select Populations, Committee on Psychological Testing, Including Validity Testing, for Social Security Administration Disability Determinations, 2015-06-29 The United States Social Security Administration SSA administers two disability programs Social Security Disability Insurance SSDI for disabled individuals and their dependent family members who have worked and contributed to the Social Security trust funds and Supplemental Security Income SSSI which is a means tested program based on income and financial assets for adults aged 65 years or older and disabled adults and children Both programs require that claimants have a disability and meet specific medical criteria in order to qualify for benefits SSA establishes the presence of a medically determined impairment in individuals with mental disorders other than intellectual disability through the use of standard diagnostic criteria which include symptoms and signs These impairments are established largely on reports of signs and symptoms of impairment and functional limitation Psychological Testing in the Service of Disability Determination considers the use of psychological tests in evaluating disability claims submitted to the SSA This report critically reviews selected psychological tests including symptom validity tests that could contribute to SSA disability determinations The report discusses the possible uses of such tests and their contribution to disability determinations Psychological Testing in the Service of Disability Determination discusses testing norms qualifications for administration of tests administration of tests and reporting results The recommendations of this report will help SSA improve the consistency and accuracy of disability determination in certain cases **Red Book on Work Incentives**, 1991

2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design Department Justice, 2014-10-09 a Design and construction 1 Each facility or part of a facility constructed by on behalf of or for the use of a public entity shall be designed and constructed in such manner that the facility or part of the facility is readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities if the construction was commenced after January 26 1992 2 Exception for structural impracticability i Full compliance with the requirements of this section is not required where a public entity can demonstrate that it is structurally impracticable to meet the requirements Full compliance will be considered structurally impracticable only in those rare circumstances when the unique characteristics of terrain prevent the incorporation of accessibility features ii If full compliance with this section would be structurally impracticable compliance with this section is required to the extent that it is not structurally impracticable In that case any portion of the facility that can be made accessible shall be made accessible to the extent that it is not structurally impracticable iii If providing accessibility in conformance with this section to individuals with certain disabilities e g those who use wheelchairs would be structurally impracticable accessibility shall nonetheless be ensured to persons with other types of disabilities e g those who use crutches or who have sight hearing or mental impairments in accordance with this section **Medical and Dental Expenses**, 1990 *HIV and Disability* Institute of Medicine, Board on the Health of Select Populations, Committee on Social Security HIV Disability Criteria, 2010-11-17 The Social Security Administration SSA uses a screening tool called the Listing of Impairments to identify claimants who are so severely impaired

Mental Disorders and Disabilities Among Low-Income Children National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, Institute of Medicine, Board on Children, Youth, and Families, Board on the Health of Select Populations, Committee to Evaluate the Supplemental Security Income Disability Program for Children with Mental Disorders, 2015-10-28 Children living in poverty are more likely to have mental health problems and their conditions are more likely to be severe Of the approximately 1.3 million children who were recipients of Supplemental Security Income SSI disability benefits in 2013 about 50% were disabled primarily due to a mental disorder An increase in the number of children who are recipients of SSI benefits due to mental disorders has been observed through several decades of the program beginning in 1985 and continuing through 2010 Nevertheless less than 1% of children in the United States are recipients of SSI disability benefits for a mental disorder At the request of the Social Security Administration *Mental Disorders and Disability Among Low Income Children* compares national trends in the number of children with mental disorders with the trends in the number of children receiving benefits from the SSI program and describes the possible factors that may contribute to any differences between the two groups This report provides an overview of the current status of the diagnosis and treatment of mental disorders and the levels of impairment in the U.S. population under age 18 The report focuses on 6 mental disorders chosen due to their prevalence and the severity of disability attributed to those disorders within the SSI disability program attention deficit hyperactivity disorder oppositional defiant disorder conduct disorder autism spectrum disorder intellectual disability learning disabilities and mood disorders While this report is not a comprehensive discussion of these disorders *Mental Disorders and Disability Among Low Income Children* provides the best currently available information regarding demographics diagnosis treatment and expectations for the disorder time course both the natural course and under treatment
