 - a. Both play a role in preventing disease
 - b. Innate immunity is non-specific, fast, general mechanisms with no memory
 - c. Adaptive immunity is specific to a particular pathogen, which it remembers and is slow

- 2) Describe the three types of barriers of innate immunity that form the first line of defense.
 - a. Mechanical barriers – skin, epithelial cell barriers, air/liquid flow, mucus
 - b. Chemical Barriers – antimicrobial peptides, Low pH, enzymes
