Though the coverage of topics focuses on European notions of art and their transplantation and transformation in North America, space is also given to cross-fertilizations with other traditions—including the art of Latin America, the Soviet Union, India, Africa (and Afro-Caribbean), Australia, and Canada. As the author emphasizes, many works by western artists are valuable not only as illustrations but as scientific documents, imbued with cultural meaning.
