Deeply researched and decidedly original, *The Moving Statues of Seventeenth-*

*Century Amsterdam* uncovers a wealth of information about these nearly forgotten public pleasure parks, situating them within popular culture, religious controversies, global trade relations, and intellectual debates of the seventeenth century. It will appeal in particular to scholars in art history and early modern studies.

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
